Sarah Senior Activity Centre (SAC)

施乐乐龄中心 helps to improve the quality of life of the elderly living in HDB one-room flats at Jalan Bukit Merah. SAC serves as a drop-in, crisis monitoring and resource centre that encourages the elderly to live independently in the community.

Evergreen Circle Senior Activity Centre (SAC)

长青坊乐龄中心 located in the HDB "Granny Flats" at Tampines St 81 is a connecting place for the young and old. EC reaches out to the frail and vulnerable elderly while promoting inter-generational activities and programmes.

Hannah Senior Activity Centre (SAC) is a new centre we will be setting up at Toh Yi Drive to support the seniors to age-in-place and remain active (to be ready by April 2016).

Dorcas Home Care 家居护理 assists the frail and vulnerable elderly in our community through meals delivery, escort for medical appointments, housekeeping and personal hygiene services.

Emergency Relief Scheme 紧急经济援助 provides short-term financial assistance to families and individuals in dire financial straits, e.g. sudden loss of sole breadwinner, illnesses etc.

The Integrated Childcare Programme (ICCP) is an inclusive programme which allows children, aged 2-6 years, with special needs to learn alongside their regular peers in a mainstream setting.

You Raise Me Up...

Kiran 女士今年四十六岁。她患有高血压,心脏病和糖尿病。两年前因病情恶化促使她失去右腿。

虽然后来装上了义肢但行动还是很不方便。因为丈夫需要工作, 白天她是独自一人在家。由于行动不便造成日常生活起居的问题,也因如此她也经常没法到医院复诊。她一度感到沮丧。

后来她被转介到"多加家居护理服务",接受每日送饭食和医院复诊接送服务。由于丈夫收入不高,我们提供她免费服务。

有了妥善的日常生活和医疗照顾,Kiran女士的病情才能稳定下来,人也变得开朗多。

DORCAS Home Care provides home help service to many of these frail and vulnerable elderly, through meals delivery, escort for medical appointments, housekeeping and personal hygiene assistance. Many of these elderly are from low income background.

Dorcas Home Care depends on donations from the public to keep supporting these elderly with our services so that they are able to remain in the community for as long as possible. dm Kiran (not her real name), 46, suffers from hypertension, diabetes and heart disease. She had to undergo a knee amputation on her right leg two years ago because of diabetes.

Although a prosthetic leg was fitted to help her regain her mobility, she faced difficulties balancing with her new limb. In addition, she could not negotiate the 3 steps at the flat's entrance as it was not wheel-chair accessible.

Her husband, the sole breadwinner, has to work during the day. As a result she missed several of her medical appointments. Sometimes she would miss a meal if the food ran out and there was nobody to buy for her.

She was subsequently referred to Dorcas Home Care by Agency for Integrated Care in Oct 2015 for assistance. After assessing her needs, meals were provided to her through our Meals-On-Wheels Service. Our staff also brought her for her medical appointments with our wheelchair friendly transport. We decided to waive all fees to lessen the family's financial burden.

Today, she is more light hearted and confident to face the future as her basic needs are being taken cared of.
